CHRISTIAN LIFE COMMUNITY

Local Christian Life Communities combine silent prayer and sharing. They usually consist of 4-8 people who meet once a fortnight, sometimes weekly, to pray together and to help each other to grow more aware of Christ in every part of their daily lives. Their approach to prayer and life is based on the spirituality of St Ignatius of Loyola and many people have found that their membership of a local CLC provides continuing support and inspiration after making an Ignatian retreat. There are over 40 local communities in England and Wales.

THE WORLD COMMUNITY FOR CHRISTIAN MEDITATION

The community is a worldwide spiritual network of people who follow the ancient Christian practice of silent prayer taught in the twentieth century by the late John Main OSB. Many meditators meet weekly in small groups for mutual encouragement and support, to hear a short teaching – and to meditate together. Each group is ecumenical and welcomes all. There are 270 groups in Great Britain and 140 in Ireland (the Republic and Northern Ireland).

THE FELLOWSHIP OF CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER

Fellowship of Christians from all denominations. The method of contemplative prayer practiced consists of mentally repeating words recorded in the Bible as having been spoken by God, either through the prophets or, pre-eminently, through his Son Jesus Christ, so that the words of God may come to work in us. The Rule, obligatory for a year at a time, includes the daily practice of contemplative prayer and weekly intercession for other members. There are about 60 groups in the UK.

SERVANTS OF CHRIST THE KING

A fellowship of small ecumenical groups called Companies (mostly lay, some clerical, some mixed). A Company 'waits upon God' in silence (normally for half an hour) after which there is a controlled discussion, when each member may speak without interruption. Each company adopts a common concern and decisions must be unanimous. There are about 15 Companies in the UK.
